The Lajkonik Procession 2 June (Thursday)

11.45

Assembly at the headquarters of the Municipal Water and Sewage Works at Senatorska 1.

12.00

St Mary's trumpet call, played by a *włóczek* (raftsman) from the Lajkonik procession.

12.15

The procession will start from the assembly point towards Kościuszki Street, cross the bridge over the Rudawa River, and enter the courtyard of the Norbertine Sisters monastery. The procession will slowly proceed down Senatorska Street while the Lajkonik collects his "tribute" from local merchants.

13.00 - 13.45

Games in the monastery courtyard. The Tartars and rafters form a circle around the Lajkonik and the banner-man. The first traditional dance of the Lajkonik with the banner takes place. It symbolises the Tartar invasion.

13.45 - 15.30

The Lajkonik and the procession proceed down Kościuszki Street, looking into shops and other businesses. The procession will take a break at the Smil'y bar at Kościuszki 14.

15.30 - 15.40

The procession will cross the intersection of Kościuszki and Zwierzyniecka Streets with Aleja Krasińskiego.

15.40 - 16.15

Procession break at the Lajkonik bar. At the same time, in a nearby square (corner of Zwierzyniecka and Powiśle Streets), a herald tells the gathered audience about the Lajkonik legend and tradition.

16.15 - 17.15

The procession continues down Zwierzyniecka Street towards Franciszkańska Street. The Lajkonik visits businesses.

At the Philharmonic, the rafters and Tartars form a circle, in which the Lajkonik will perform a dance with the banner.

17.30 - 17.45

The Lajkonik visits the Bishops' Palace at Franciszkańska 3. Laying of flowers at the John Paul II statue. The Lajkonik performs a bow with the banner.

18.00 - 18.30

Procession break in Plac Wszystkich Świętych at the Polakowski restaurant. During the break, members of the procession are posted in front of the restaurant. They play the drums and present their costumes and arms to the gathered audience.

At this time, the spectacle "Lajkoniku laj, laj, laj" takes place on the stage in Main Square, preparing the audience to welcome the Lajkonik:
